Safety, Security and Awareness

Board Member Michael Grayum organized a meeting with our local Community Liaison Officer, Brandon Showalter and Safe St ® Community Mobilization Specialist, Kathy Martin. The meeting was held on June 29th immediately prior to the monthly HOA meeting.

In that meeting, we were given great information on preventing crime. We will share that information in multiple parts in upcoming newsletters. Officer Showalter advised that car break-ins and thefts as well as mail theft is up. Raising the level of awareness and paying attention to what is going on around us is key to preventing crime. We can deter crime by doing the following:

- Keep your house lit up at night.
- Install a locking mailbox or open a PO Box.
- Install an alarm with a siren. Sirens go a long way to preventing crime even if they don't notify an alarm company.
- Report street lights that are out. You can do this by calling 3-1-1 or,
- Tacoma First 311 app allows you to submit a report with a photo and notes your location.
- Know your neighbors and their routines.

Burglars look for signs that it's ok to break-in and try to fit-in while doing so. They may carry a clipboard or wear a uniform. They may hang flyers on a door can come back in a few days to see if it's still there. If you see someone or something that is out of place, take a picture if you can or mental notes if you can't. Here are some tips to help officers identify a potential criminal:

- Start at the head and work your way down
- What color is the hair?
- Is he wearing a hat?
- Does he have facial hair? What kind?
- Is he wearing glasses?
- Does he have tattoos?
- Are there emblems on his clothing?
- What color are his clothes?
- If he is standing beside a vehicle, how far above the vehicle is his head? This will help in calculating height.
- Is there anything about his gait that is noticeable?

Always call 9-1-1 if you are unsure if you have an emergency situation or should call the non-emergency line. Dispatchers will transfer you to the nonemergency staff if they determine it is a non-emergency. Obtaining and preparing to share as much information about the person or incident you are calling about will aide dispatchers and officers in responding to you.
